# Fall Cleanup



Flourish Lawn & Yard Services will do two cycles of leaf cleanup as the leaves drop (estimated in November and December). Flourish Lawn & Yard Services will also come again, when most of the leaves have fallen. Fall shrub trimming and tree trimming will happen later, depending on the weather, with many shrubs being cut back much further before winter.

Frank McSherry, Flourish Lawn & Yard, will be lowering days for the sprinklers, until the Irrigation Dept shuts off the canal water.

### **Snow Removal**



Frank McSherry with Flourish Lawn & Yard Services will remove snow when we receive between 2-4 inches of snow. He will look at the weather and will not shovel snow if the temperatures are due to rise with the sun coming out. If snow is predicted for multiple days, snow removal will occur after the snow stops.

Snow will be removed from each sidewalk (from the front door to the driveway and to the mailbox) and driveway. Ice melt will be applied.

Due to safety, possible legal issues, and the increasing age of our residents, please do not remove the snow yourself.

# **Speed Bumps**



Due to excessive speeds in our community, a suggestion was made to install speed bumps. The Board researched this and won't pursue it due to the high cost.

Please remember to drive carefully and slow down.

## Traffic Signal at Ten Mile



A request was made for the Board to see if a traffic signal could be placed at Teter Blvd. and Ten Mile Road, due to it being difficult to leave or enter our neighborhood.

Sue Peters called ACHD to ask about having a traffic signal installed. Sue was told that due to the number of cars coming off Teter Blvd., it does not generate enough traffic to justify a traffic signal. It doesn't help that Teter Blvd. ends at Ten Mile Road and does not continue across the street.

To help you, we've included directions in this mailing for how to exit the neighborhood without having to go on Ten Mile Road.



# Age Is Just a Number



Did you know that up to 20% of homeowners in The Fairways can be under 55 years old? Wouldn't it be nice to have some younger homeowners in our community who might be willing to participate in some of the volunteer and Board member positions going forward?

#### According to our CC&Rs:

- 80% of the occupied lots must be occupied by at least one person 55 years of age.
- 20% of the occupied lots can by occupied by a person who is over 18 years of age.
- No person under 18 years of age may regularly reside upon or occupy a Lot at any time.

This has been added to the Realtors and Prospective Buyers of Property document in the Policy Guide (page A-18).

# **Scam Prevention Tips**



Each year, millions of seniors fall victim to some type of fraud or scheme. The FBI estimates that seniors lose more than \$3 billion each year to fraudsters.

#### Recognize scammers. They may:

- PRETEND to be from an agency or organization you know.
- Say there's a PROBLEM or promise a prize.
- PRESSURE you to act immediately.
- Tell you to PAY in a specific way.
- Use an EMAIL address that looks legitimate.

#### How to avoid a scam:

- Don't act quickly. Scams are based on fear and urgency.
- Remain calm. Talk to someone you trust.
- Use caller ID on your phone. Be suspicious of fake caller IDs. The Government won't contact you by phone.
- Hang up or ignore the message.
- DO NOT click on links of attachments in suspicious emails.
- Protect your money. Avoid odd payment types. Criminals will insist that you pay in a hard-to-trace manner, such as with a gift card, prepaid debit card, cryptocurrency, wire transfer, money transfer, or by mailing cash.
- Protect your personal information. Be skeptical of a contact you didn't initiate. Do not reveal personal information.
