

The board is working with the landscape company on a beautification project of our entrances. You should see work beginning very soon.


## Watch Out For Our Kids!

## Cats & Dogs

The complaints also include barking dogs, at all hours of the day and night. Most disputes between neighbors arise due to animals. And please, please, please – help us keep the common area a beautiful and sanitary place for children to play by cleaning up after your animals.



#### **Pet Waste Eliminator Station**

The board has installed a pet waste eliminator station in the northeast common area. This station will provide bags to pick up after your pet. You will still need to properly dispose of the waste.

## Shrubs & Trees

Each property owner is responsible to ensure that their trees and shrubs are trimmed up. Those that protrude out over the sidewalk are not only a nuisance but a safety hazard. The same applies for trees that have limbs that hang down far enough for someone to walk into. Please check your property for these hazards and remedy as soon as possible. The board will be conducting a walk through very soon to find out who may need an extra reminder.



# **Exterior Lighting**

Most street lighting in our community is provided by the lamps in each resident's yard. Keeping these lamps operational keeps our community safe and beautiful, and is the responsibility of residents. If you are having trouble with a broken or shorted out power cord, a fellow neighbor has suggested swapping out the upper section of the lamp post with a replacement LED solar powered unit.



# **Summer Outdoor Fun**

Summer means its time to enjoy our boats, campers and recreational vehicles. Residents are reminded that parking of these vehicles on the street should be limited to preparing them for use or preparing them for storage after use. Parking of these items in your driveway is limited by our CC&Rs to a period not to exceed 48 hours. Access Storage provides affordable parking for recreational vehicles within easy walking distance of Trailside Place.

- ☐ Trash and recycling bins need to be stored so that they are not visible from the street.
- $\Box$  Please remember that all parking passes must be requested at least <u>48</u> hours in advance. This can now be done on the Trailside Place page located on the Riverside Management website.
